

### P.L. 34-110

AKA <u>10GCA CH54B</u> "Choose to Reuse: Mungnga Ma Ayek I Plastek Act of 2018." Ban of Single use plastic bags at Retail and Wholesale Establishments.

- January 1, 2019: Effective date
- January 1, 2021:
  - Ban on single use plastic bags
  - § 54B103.Use of Disposable carryout bags made of plastic, including plastics made from bio-based polymers, shall be biodegradable or compostable; and if otherwise not biodegradable or compostable, be made of high-density polyethylene (HDPE) film marked with the SPI resin identification code 2.

- July 1, 2025
  - Extends the effective date of the paper bag ban for retail and wholesale establishments to July 1, 2025









## What are the exemptions?

#### § 54B102

(b) disposable carryout bag means any bag that is provided to a consumer by a retail or wholesale establishment at the point of sale to carry purchases. A disposable carryout bag shall not include any of the following:





### What are the exemptions?

#### § 54B102

■ (b)(1) a bag provided to the consumer for use in a retail or wholesale establishment to package bulk items, such as fruits, vegetables, nuts, grains, candy, meats, poultry, or fish;





#### § 54B102

□ (b)(2) a bag provided to the consumer for use in a retail or wholesale establishment to package small hardware items;





#### § 54B102

 (b)(3) a bag to contain or wrap flowers, potted plants, or other items where dampness may be a problem;








#### § 54B102

 (b)(4) a bag to contain nonprepackaged food items or bakery goods;









#### § 54B102

 (b)(5) a bag provided by a pharmacy to carry prescription drugs;





§ 54B102

(b)(6) a bag used for newspapers;





§ 54B102

■ (b)(7) a bag used for laundry dry-cleaning;





#### § 54B102

■ (b)(8) bags sold in packages containing multiple bags intended for garbage, pet waste, or yard waste;







#### § 54B102

 (b(9) a bag used to package and secure fragile merchandise;







#### § 54B102

□ (b(10) a bag used to help insulate frozen items; or









#### § 54B102

- □ (b)(11) a reusable carryout bag as defined by this Chapter;
- (c) reusable carryout bag means a bag specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse, and is made of cloth, fiber, or other machine washable fabric;

P.L. 35-110 Choose to Reuse: Mungnga Ma Ayek I Plastek Act of 2018."

- § 54B104.
- •(a) The Agency shall be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this Chapter.
- •(b-e) Penalties
- •(f) The Administrator of the Agency, in coordination with the Chief Technology Officer of the Office of Technology, shall establish and promote an email address or other tool for digital reporting that consumers and businesses may utilize to report violations, or to ask questions regarding the implementation of this Chapter, with a prompt response from the Agency.

# § 54B104. Enforcement and Penalties


#### Civil penalties

- (1) not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for the first offense;
- (2) an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for the second offense; and
- (3) an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for any offense thereafter during a one (1)-year period.

No more than one (1) penalty shall be imposed upon any entity within a seven (7)-day period.
